The first 15 minutes of each regular meeting is set aside for members of the public to comment on any item within the jurisdiction of the Group, but not appearing on the agenda. Items presented under public comment may not be discussed or acted upon by the Group at this time. For items appearing on the agenda, the public is invited to comment at the time the item is called for consideration by the Group. Any person addressing the Group under public comment will be limited to a 3-minute presentation to ensure that all interested parties have an opportunity to speak. Also, all persons addressing the Group must state their name and county of residence for the record.

Items of Interest

- The CDFA announced that the State Water Efficiency and Enhancement Program (SWEEP) will make approximately \$40 million available for block grants, incentivizing agricultural operations to invest in irrigation systems that increase water use efficiency and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Under the pilot program, qualified organizations, such as Resource Conservation Districts (RCDs), Irrigation Districts (IDs), Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSAs), and agricultural non-profit organizations, may apply for state funding and, if selected, then disburse funds to eligible farmers, ranchers, or agricultural operations for on-farm projects. Eligible block grant entities may request between \$2 million and \$5 million for each program.

 DWR has recently developed and released the <u>Considerations for Identifying</u> and <u>Addressing Drinking Water Well Impacts</u> guidance document and technical assistance.

The Department also released a brochure, called <u>Alignment and Coordination: Water Shortage Planning for Rural Communities and Sustainable Groundwater Management</u>. This brochure encourages voluntary collaboration between counties and GSAs as they coordinate their respective responsibilities for drought and water shortage planning efforts, for rural communities under Senate Bill 552, and the long-term sustainability goals of groundwater basins under SGMA.

- California has announced funding for the next round of the <u>Sustainable</u> <u>Agricultural Lands Conservation (SALC) Program</u>, which fights climate change by providing grants to projects that conserve agricultural lands and encourage sustainable development. The amount of funding for the upcoming Round 9 solicitation will be determined later this year. More information on applying for SALC grants can be found by <u>clicking here</u>.
- The <u>Draft Drought Plan for Madera County</u> is now available for review and comment. This drought plan is in response to SB 552. Comments are due by May 31st and must be sent to <u>wnr@maderacounty.com</u>
- The USDA has announced their Emergency Community Water Assistance Grants program which has a rolling application deadline. This program supports eligible communities prepare, or recover from, an emergency that threatens the availability of safe, reliable drinking water. Eligible applicants must show a decline in quantity or quality of water that occurred within two years of the date of the application or that a significant decline in quantity or
